**Citi's "Global Community Day" Mobilizes
Over 55,000 Volunteers in 100 Countries**

Around 1,000 volunteers to support Citi's projects in Japan

Tokyo - Citi will hold the second "Global Community Day" on November 17, 2007. "Global Community Day" is an initiative in which Citi employees and their families participate in volunteer activities in order to make a difference in 100 countries where its employees live and work.

This year employees of Nikko Cordial Corporation, with whom Citi formed a comprehensive strategic alliance, will also participate in "Global Community Day". Around 1,000 volunteers will support 16 programs in Japan, and over 55,000 volunteers, including employees and their families, will participate in more than 1,000 events in over 600 cities in 100 countries. While many Citi employees volunteer year-round in their communities, "Global Community Day" is an annual initiative to have company employees, along with their families and friends, come together as a global volunteer team on a single day each year. Local volunteer teams will be working in North America, Asia Pacific, Latin America, Europe, the Middle East, and Africa on a variety of projects addressing specific community needs, including literacy, housing, environmental protection, nutrition and health care.

"Citi is committed to mobilizing the enthusiasm and talents of our employees so that they can make a positive difference in the communities where we work together with different business practice", said Pamela Flaherty, President and Chief Executive Officer, Citi Foundation and Director, Corporate Citizenship.

Highlights of Citi's volunteer projects from around the world:

<Global Community Day Activities>

Date: Saturday, November 17, 2007

1. Japan

- **Tohoku Area:** Cleaning up at facilities of the guide dog association (Sendai)
- **Kanto Area:** Distributing food for homeless (Tokyo), creating mosaics of children's artwork that will be presented at the Olympics in Beijing (Tokyo), collecting used stamps (Tokyo), cleaning up Arakawa river (Tokyo), playing and coaching sports with students at a foster home (Tokyo), hiking with students from a foster home (Tochigi), cleaning up Shonan Beach (Kanagawa) and cleaning up at facilities of the guide dog association (Kanagawa)
- **Kansai Area:** Cleaning up Yodogawa River (Osaka), Cleaning up at facilities of the guide dog association (Osaka)
- **Okinawa Area:** Cleaning up one of Okinawa's beaches
- **Nation-wide:** Collecting used stamps

2. International

- **New York:** Volunteers are collecting and “scrubbing” cell phones for local crisis centers. Hundreds are walking/running to raise funds for the World Food Program's school feeding initiatives. And others are teaching financial education, delivering Thanksgiving dinners, and painting murals in schools.
- **Connecticut:** Citi volunteers are cleaning a river and restoring a park's skating rink in concert with a long-standing non-profit partner.
- **Across the U.S.:** Branches and offices across the country are collecting food donations and delivering to local food pantries.
- **Poland and Turkey:** Volunteers are conducting financial education workshops to adults and children.
- **Brazil, Columbia, and Panama:** Volunteers are building homes, revitalizing neighborhoods, and refurbishing schools.
- **Peru:** Rebuilding schools destroyed in recent earthquake
- **China:** Employees are distributing energy-saving light bulbs and environmentally safe shopping bags
- **Mexico:** Volunteers are coordinating a country-wide food drive in 54 cities, working in conjunction with a national food bank network
- **Canada:** Improving homeless shelter conditions
